This meant I was given the opportunity on several occasions to share the Gospel with various different colleagues. After listening to life stories, differing issues and reasons why each individual didn't call themselves a Christian, I found myself asking the same question, "What are you going to do with Jesus?"

We can have all the excuses under the sun and varying different beliefs going on but the Person of Jesus Christ is a real, historical figure. It's a fact that this Man walked the face of the Earth over two thousand years ago, claimed to be the Son of the living God and the only way to enter Heaven. My question to everyone is the same, what are you going to do with this information?

Sadly we know that every single one of us is going to die at some point, nobody gets out of here alive! No matter what we have chosen to believe in our lifetime there will come the moment when we come face to face with our Maker.

Now I adore talking about the love, grace, patience and mercy of God. It brings me such joy to share with others how Jesus forgives everyone who comes to Him in repentance and it's His desire that none should perish. While I've found that delivering the message of grace is a relatively easy thing to do, the flip side to that however isn't quite as enjoyable. The message of judgement isn't a comfortable one to share but that doesn't make it any less important. I think it's imperative to give people the full picture so that they know what the options are.
